29th MAY 2016 THE BODY AND BLOOD OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST (C) Psalter Week 1

This is another feast that is now celebrated on Sundays in England and Wales - which will hopefully allow more people to enter into the mystery of the Eucharist we celebrate!

The Eucharist is not an invention of the Church: it is a part of God's plan of salvation from the very beginning: it is prefigured in the Old Testament, seen today in the food offerings of Melchizedek, priest king of Jerusalem associated with Abraham, choose bread and wine as the offerings. It is also revealed by the prophetic action of Jesus, in feeding the multitude, before he feeds the Church with the gift that is transmitted through the centuries. The Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, is our communication with the Father, in the Spirit: it is the real presence in the Church's 'here and now' of the eternal God; it is Covenant, Memorial and Promise, Meal and Sacrifice, the heartbeat of the Family of Believers

<u>Today's Liturgy</u>

1st Reading Genesis 14: 18-20

This text, of obscure origin, serves to identify Jerusalem as a place of sacrifice throughout the whole history of the people. The figure of Melchizedek is that of an ideal king – priest, which from the outset Christians were using as a type for their understanding of Christ as the great High Priest (Hebrews 5: 6-10; 6:20; 7:1-11).

2nd reading: 1 Cor 1:23-26

The appropriate celebration of the Eucharist was one of Paul's concerns for the community at Corinth. Along with *Didache*, this is our earliest reference to the Eucharist; and it reminds us that the kerygma, which would later be fixed in our written gospels, was originally repeated at these assemblies – the celebrating of Eucharist is a primary Christian reality, the texts are secondary.

Gospel Reading: Luke 9: 11-17

From the beginning the Eucharist was understood within the pattern of Christ's meals / feedings, so already when this story was incorporated by Luke into his text, it had Eucharistic significance: his meal is one of miraculous abundance for all.

Communion Reflection

They knew it was the Lord, Alleluia In the breaking up of the loaf, Alleluia. The loaf we break is the body of Jesus Christ, our Lord, Alleluia, The cup we bless is the blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord, Alleluia, For the remissions of sins, Alleluia. Lord, let your mercy rest upon us, Alleluia,

Who put all our confidence in you, Alleluia. They knew it was the Lord, Alleluia,

In the breaking of the loaf. Alleluia.

O Lord, we believe that in this breaking of your body and pouring out of your blood we become your redeemed people; We confess that in taking the gifts of this pledge here, we lay hold in hope of enjoying its true fruits in the heavenly places.
