Psalter Week 2

14th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

"Your peace will rest on that man."

The link between the First Reading and Gospel is not immediately apparent today, until you look at the "headings" which are always chosen "to make the connection between readings of the same Mass clear." (Introduction to the Lectionary n.123.) The "headings" present us with a simple picture today: a river of peace flowing out from the Lord, which we see in the Gospel as the flowing of the disciples as they are sent out on their first mission. From the Lord of Peace, others, like ripples in a pool, flow out carrying his simple message: "Peace to this house!"

PSALM

Cry out with joy to God all the earth, O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise. Say to God: "How tremendous your deeds!" "Before you all the earth shall bow; shall sing to you, sing to your name!" Come and see the works of God, tremendous his deeds among men. He turned the sea into dry land, they passed through the river dry-shod. Let our joy then be in him; he rules for ever by his might. Come and hear, all who fear God. Commentary on the Readings

First Reading: Isa 66:10-14

This is taken from the final section of the Third Isaiah which is concerned with the new temple – the final presence of God among his people – in Jerusalem. This is a reading we usually encounter in Advent and that is a guide to how it is read within the Church whenever it appears in the lectionary: the anointed one is come, and this is Jesus. He is the new and final temple, and therefore at his coming Jerusalem – which, personified, is mother of the people – can rejoice. The development of Christology of the temple owes a major debt to reflection on this section of Third Isaiah.

Second Reading: Gal 6: 14-18

This is part of Paul's farewell and blessing at the end of the letter. It contains one final shot at those who want to emphasise "the law": they are not to be heeded as it is the death of Jesus on the cross – hence that is all he is prepared to boast of – that justifies the people. Such a statement then usually provokes a question about "what does 'justify' mean?" This question is not really an issue of exegesis but a conundrum from late medieval systematic theology and only becomes problematic if one assumes there is perfect opposition between the notion of grace and works, and then this is referred back to Paul. It is better to avoid the whole question and pose a different one: what brings us as a people into the presence of the Father? The obedience of our head, and that obedience was demonstrated perfectly in a death on the cross.
