## 7<sup>th</sup> January 2018 The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord Year B Psalter Week 2

#### "We saw his star and have come to do the king homage."

In the East, this Season of Christmas is called the 'Time of Manifestation', or Showing. Today is the 'Feast of the Manifestation', or the Showing of the Saviour to the whole world, to all nations. In the wise men who travel from the East, we see all the nations other than the people of Israel being welcomed at the New Temple of the New Covenant - the new born child in the manger. A look at the Psalm response shows this: "All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord." The same is true of the key word in the second reading: "Revelation". Remember that for the people of Israel this was to be their Messiah, come to restore their fortunes. By this feast, we proclaim God's plan was to extend his salvation to men and women of every nation, of every time and every place - including us. In many ways this is our Christmas Feast, when we celebrate the Good News of the Saviour's birth revealed at last to us.

#### Lay Ministers for Funerals

A number of parishes have nominated lay people who will be authorised to conduct funerals without Mass having been delegated by the parish priest. These people have undergone an extensive formation and will be commissioned by Archbishop George Stack in their own parishes and a formal communication will be sent to the local Funeral Directors. The latter will not contact the lay people directly, but will make the usual arrangements through the parish. The lay ministers will then be involved in the planning of the funeral and in bereavement ministry. #### The Gospel of Mark

During Ordinary time we are offered the bulk of the Gospel of Mark during the Liturgy of the Word at the Sunday Eucharist. There are some significant characteristics of Mark's Gospel worth noting. It is the briefest of the Gospels and has few long passages –Jesus is always in action – the phrase "at once" or "immediately" crops up time and again. There is a real lack of understanding of who Jesus is in the gospel. The crowds are simply "amazed" or "astonished", the disciples never really understand and are frequently berated by Jesus for their lack of perception. It is only the evil spirits who know who Jesus is until the centurion confesses it at the crucifixion. It seems likely that Mark's Gospel was written for a community that experienced hardship, perhaps persecution, and the stark nature of the Gospel offers no romantic glow but a severe sense of reality; that is why Mark's Gospel is often the Gospel that addresses most effectively the struggles and difficulties of life for the faithful.
