Spirituality of Advent

Bambinelli Sunday

Pope John Paul II, during his papacy, instituted the celebration of Bambinelli Sunday on the Third Sunday of Advent – a day on which children from Rome bring to St. Peter's Square the figurine of the Christ Child from their families' Nativity sets. I invite you to bring the figures of the Child Jesus from your Nativity Scenes at home to Mass over the weekend of the <u>Third Sunday of Advent (11th/12th December)</u> for them to be blessed during Mass.

Stations of the Crown

The pupils of Our Lady's Primary School are going to lead the parish in meditating upon key

moments of the Christmas story, as we build up to the celebration of Christmas.

Early Morning Advent Mass & Breakfast

During Advent, there is an extra opportunity to celebrate Mass on <u>Tuesday mornings</u>, at 7:30am at Our Lady's Church. Breakfast will be available in the St. Anne's Room afterwards.

Suna Evenina Prayer and Benediction

Evening Prayer (Vespers) is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, a set of prayers prayed throughout the day. Here in the parish, we gather together almost every morning to pray Morning Prayer (9:40am). During the season of Advent, there is the opportunity to gather for Sung Evening Prayer and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. This will take place <u>each Sunday of Advent at Our Lady of the Angels, beginning at 5:00pm</u>. This is both open to the public and live-streamed.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a wonderful treasure. Pope Francis has reflected that: "The Lord never tires of forgiveness. It is we who are tired of asking for forgiveness. Let us ask for the grace not to tire of forgiveness, because he never tires of forgiving". During Advent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available at the following times:
